Charles Chapman Grafton, Bishop of Fond-du-Lac, our first Patron, and a life-long worker in the cause of Unity. It offers its sympathy with the Branch in America in its bereavement."
- (b) "That this General Meeting of the Union, assembled on October 22nd, 1912, records its sorrow at the death of the Rev. William Wakeford, the first Treasurer and one of the earliest members of the Committee of Foundation; at the same time expressing its sense of great loss and of gratitude for the sympathetic help and valuable labours which he gave continually to the work of the Society."

THE COLLINS MEMORIAL FUND.—It has been decided that this memorial to the special work for Unity carried on so zealously by our late President shall take the form of a large EIKON (Russian) representing Our Saviour, or the Exaltation of the Cross, to be erected if possible in the Church House, Westminster, or some central place where it may be a public witness to his hopes and the holy aims of the Society.

I have received £16 for this object, and members are now asked finally for their subscriptions in order that a worthy Eikon may be

obtained.

Orthodox Colonial Clergy Council.—This Council has provided for the beginning of the training at London University of an excellent Greek candidate for the Priesthood, who had hoped to go out to work in Canada. It is now found, however, that there is not the opening for him there that existed before, and it is evident that the best course for him after his training, during which he is studying the pastoral methods, &c., of the English Church, will be to return to Mitylene and there take up as Priest the work of the greatest value which will be open to him after such a training, where great need exists. About £50 will be needed for the course of training, and this will leave our funds free for our original object, which will be proceeded with as soon as our resources are adequate, viz.:—The providing of English-trained Orthodox Priests for our Colonies.

I should be very grateful for donations towards the above fund.

The Rev. H. G. Hellier, District Secretary, would be glad to hear of any gentleman willing to give lectures or help in such work during the coming season, and will also try to arrange lectures when desired. Lantern slides, illustrative of Eastern Church Life, can be hired. Address: Dinder Rectory, Wells, Somerset.
